

Year 3 Home Learning

Dear Parents,

Thank you for your continued support for your child's learning. I can see that such progress is being made. It is great to see their achievements after working hard and practising skills with you at home. I hope all the children are feeling proud of what they can now do and feel motivated to keep trying at new skills. I think they are all doing amazingly well in these circumstances.

The learning for this week:

Literacy - Monday is Reading Comprehension day. On Tuesday, the children are identifying language which is used to exaggerate and make something sound impressive. For the learning on Wednesday, the children will try and use their own language to make an ordinary object sound extraordinary. They will be practising the skills of summarising and note-taking on Thursday and on Friday the children will be making up a funny story or writing some jokes. They could even make their own little book.

Maths - Maths this week is learning about working out and reading scales in 'Measurement'. Practice at home at this skill would be very beneficial to support your child's learning. This could be reading a thermometer scale, reading scales on different measuring jugs or reading weighing scales. The children will learn how to work out the intervals between the numbers first so their times tables knowledge will be practiced this week too.

History - This week the children will learn about 3 different types of ships the Vikings used and how the design of the ship was linked to what it was used for.

P.E. - There is a daily challenge for P.E. this week. I hope you enjoy the activities. Please message me at the end of the week to let me how many you completed!

Science - This is a continuation of your super learning last half term on the water cycle and how water can be a liquid, a gas or a solid depending on the conditions surrounding it.
